Document Layout Issue in Lasernet BC Connector 4.3.1.0 and 4.3.1.1

Due to an issue with **Document Layout** in Lasernet BC Connector 4.3.1.0 and 4.3.1.1, XML versions of reports may contain excessive data.

The **Deactivated** checkbox on each **Filter** line of the **Document Layout** will automatically be selected when a new table is added, a new **Document Layout** is created, or a change is made to an existing **Document Layout Filter**. This can lead to excessive data in XMLs, which may become too large to process.

The issue does not occur if no changes are made to a **Document Layout**.
